
Mountain Birdwatch 2.0

Route 11: Battell Mt. North, VT

Hike Duration/Difficulty: 2 hours. 2.5 miles to LT. Hike is moderately difficult. Route/Trail Access: Skylight Pond Trail to Long Trail. Take USFS road behind Bread Loaf Campus on Route 125 E of Ripton. ~ 3 miles to Skylight Pond Trail parking area. Site is on the Long Trail, begin going S, then turn north after Point 1.

1	Facing N from point 1.	Facing S from point 1.	N 43.98648 W 72.93752 Elev(m) 1050	10 m N of tree across path ~1 foot diameter. 3 m N of root system across path (of a stump). 5 m N of 2 step-up stones.
2	Facing E from point 2.	Facing S from point 2.	N 43.98873 W 72.93716 Elev(m) 1045	25m N of trail junction with Skylight Pond Trail/LT, 10 m past cut snag on ground either side of trail, 3 m past end of stepping stones.
3	Facing E from point 3.	Facing S from point 3.	N 43.99096 W 72.9365 Elev(m) 1046	5 m N of jagged stump 2 m tall to E, messy blowdown to W. Stumps ~ 1 ft high in trail just S of point. Larger 2m jagged stump. Level area ~ 5 m before short dropoff. View to E.
4	Facing N from point 4.	Facing S from point 4.	N 43.99327 W 72.93665 Elev(m) 1072	Trail turns R abruptly after steep climb. Turns N after travelling W. Point is at rock water bar with obvious drainage going S. Double white blaze on balsam fir at point. Note: area w/similar description ~25m before this pt. but w/o double blaze.
5	Facing E from point 5.	Facing S from point 5.	N 43.99551 W 72.93601 Elev(m) 1153	South picture is SW to show trail, ~ 100m beyond steep climb. Point at bend in trail to L. Trail zigzags for 20 m before point. Point just before you hit ridgeline.
6	Facing E from point 6.	Facing S from point 6.	N 43.99749 W 72.93749 Elev(m) 1143	Trail begins to drop after long flat. 10 m after spiky treefall to the E. Point is on left turn on a flat spot after gentle downhill from treefall.

Please survey this route in order, beginning with point 1.
