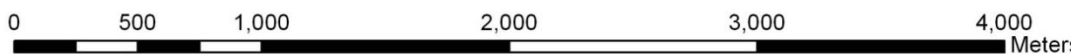
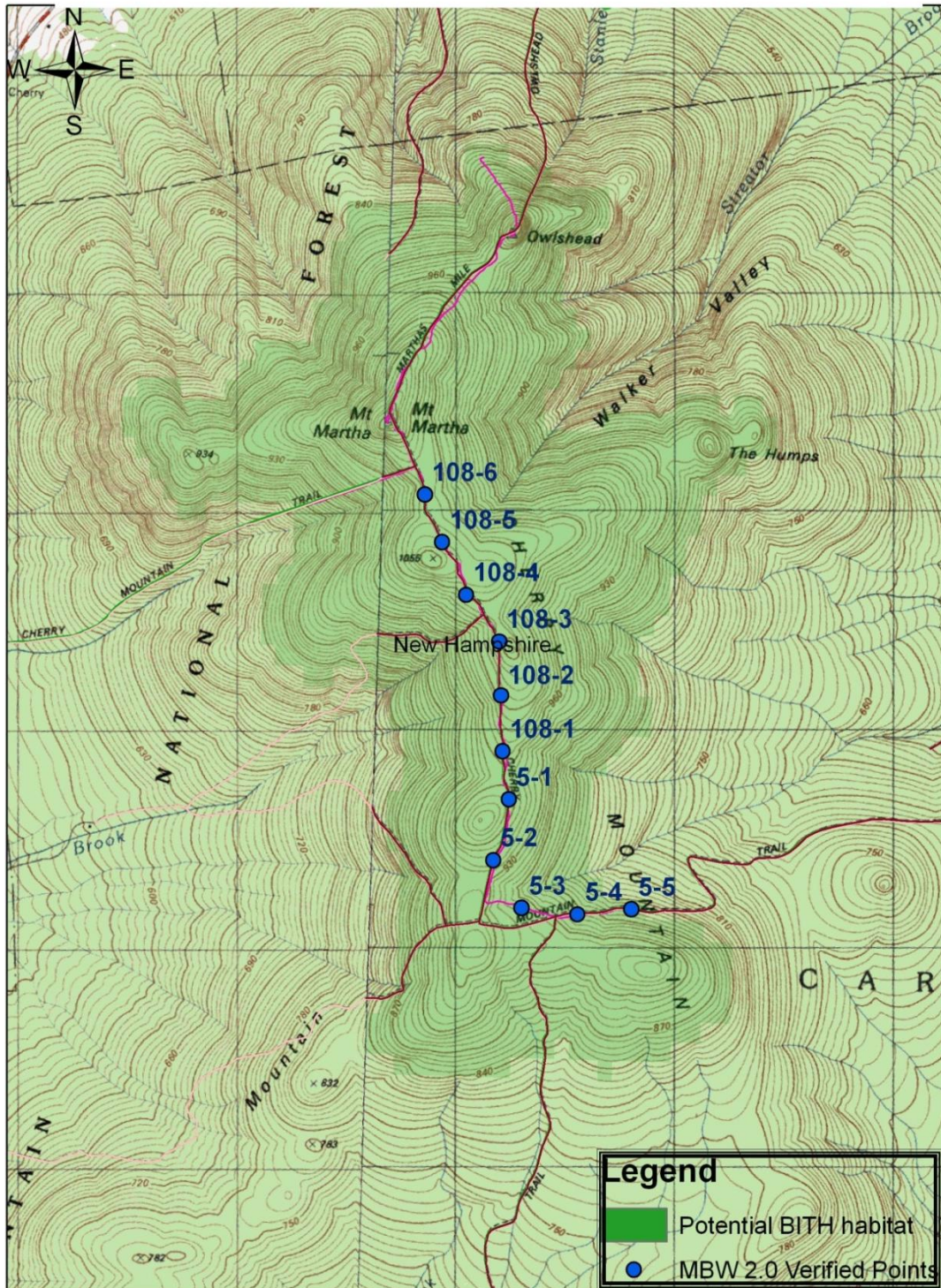
## Route 5: Cherry Mountain, NH

**Hike Duration/Difficulty:** 2.5 hours, 1 hour 15 min with alternate route











**Route/Trail Access:** NH-115 to Cherry Mountain Trail, R on Cherry Mountain Road. **Alternate route access:** Access Cherry Mountain Trail from height of land on Old Cherry Mountain Road (FR14). Distance to point 1 ~ 2.5+ miles, gentle grade.

Pt #	Picture 1	Picture 2	GPS <sup>1</sup>	Description
<b>1</b>	 Facing N from point 1.	 Facing W from point 1.	N 44.31538 W 71.49163  Elev(m) 961	Rock in center of trail. NW side of trail has fallen trees and one broken tree leaning. SE side has fallen tree lining edge of trail. NE side has rock on edge where trail turns N-NW.
<b>2</b>	 Facing E from point 2.	 Facing W from point 2.	N 44.31277 W 71.49248  Elev(m) 943	Fallen tree lining E side of trail. At N end of tree is a flat rock. About 2m from trail on W, broken stump and short downed trees. To N, 10m, a rock on W side of trail where trail turns E slightly.
<b>3</b>	 Facing E from point 3.	 Facing W from point 3.	N 44.31085 W 71.49095  Elev(m) 913	Point is 50 meters E of wooden bridge. Fallen tree leaning on snag to NE. Cut logs on side of trail to E and dead tree lying on S side directly across from logs. 30 cm dbh red spruce snag with many bare, broken branches to NE.
<b>4</b>	 Facing E from point 4.	 Facing S from point 4.	N 44.31060 W 71.48749  Elev(m) 877	Coming from W, point is 100m E of 2 <sup>nd</sup> wooden bridge. To E, two birches are bending above and across trail. Trail curves to SE after passing bending birches when travelling E. Broken birch top is caught in bending birch.
<b>5</b>	 Facing S from point 5.	 Facing W from point 5.	N 44.31093 W 71.48446  Elev(m) 859	3 cut birch stumps still erect but less than 1m tall to the S-SW on edge of trail. 2 very large birches (one alive, one dead) W on either side of trail.

**\*Please survey this route in order, beginning with point 1.\***
