## **Mountain Birdwatch 2.0**


Route 111: Kibby Mt., ME

## Hike Duration/Difficulty: 1 hr.

Route/Trail Access: From Route 201, take Spencer Road (unpaved) about 27 miles west to Beaudry Road. (Google maps confusingly labels Spencer as Hardscrabble Road along its eastern half and Appleton Road along its western half, while Beaudry is referred to as Goldbrook Road.) A Maine Atlas and a car Garmin unit will help – road junctions are not always marked with road names. Be careful of logging trucks – they have right of way and will take it! Take Beaudry 5 miles south to Kibby Mountain Road. Drive uphill about 250m to a small parking area and a junction with an ATV trail that leads up Kibby Mountain. Follow this trail uphill until it becomes a footpath. Stay to the right at the only trail junction.

1	Facing E from pt 1.	Facing W from pt 1.	N 45.42489 W 70.55029 Elev(m) 941	Point is 350m S of curve in trail, 200m from fork in trail (where one turns right as one hikes up the mountain). E edge of trail rises, W descends. Trail opens slightly to W with a single yellow birch.
2	Facing E from pt 2.	Facing W from pt 2.	N 45.42648 W 70.55062 Elev(m) 961	About 50m E uptrail from semi- clearing where trail curves almost completely around. From curve, point is at the first small hill
3	Facing N from pt 3.	Facing S from pt 3.	N 45.42515 W 70.54795 Elev(m) 1005	Snapped birch to W. Trail somewhat rocky. To S, broken tree still partially attached hanging upside down in trail. Ground rises to E side of trail. 2 larger mossy rocks on W side.
4	Facing N from pt 4.	Facing S from pt 4.	N 45.42343 W 70.54588 Elev(m) 1035	Very rocky trail – trail is almost all rock. Point is at largest rock at the start of a sharper incline up the trail.  After an incline of about 2m the trail becomes more grassy. Eroded earth on W side of incline.
5	Facing N from pt 5.	Facing S from pt 5.	N 45.42124 W 70.54476 Elev(m) 1065	Trail bumps up suddenly if walking from N-S toward the summit. Trees fallen on E & W sides of trail before the sharp rise in elevation. On W side there is an opening where trees have fallen. Trail is slightly rocky.
6	Facing N from pt 6.	Facing S from pt 6.	N 45.41924 W 70.54482 Elev(m) 1099	Relatively flat, rocky trail. W and E have fewer trees with views. Point is about 75m N below summit where lookout tower is.
