
Route 13: Passaconaway, NH

Hike Duration/Difficulty: 2-4 hours

Route/Trail Access: Route 112 via Oliverian Brook Trail, Passaconaway Cutoff, and Square Ledge to East Loop and Rollins.

1	Facing E from point 1.	Facing W from point 1.	N 43.95093 W 71.37959 Elev(m) 1076	70m E of Walden & Rollins trail junction, and N up the East Loop of Mt. Passaconaway. Point is at a turn from NE to the N where SE has only sparse trees. Point is at the rock in the corner of the turn.
2	Facing E from point 2.	Facing S from point 2.	N 43.95082 W 71.38451 Elev(m) 1057	200m E from trail junction signs for Dicey's Mill & Rollins. Point is in middle of opening where ground substrate is very fine gravel and a stream/streambed cuts across the trail. Large log on S side of trail running parallel to it, and log half its size runs N-S along streambed.
3	Facing S from point 3.	Facing W from point 3.	N 43.94860 W 71.38497 Elev(m) 1000	5m S of 5 rock steps. 40M S from trail junction – Dicey's Mill & Rollins.
4	Facing N from point 4.	Facing S from point 4.	N 43.94654 W 71.38374 Elev(m) 970	Point is beside a 2-foot Diameter at Breast Height (DBH) yellow birch on E side of trail. 5M to N along trail, a 1m rootball on E side of trail. 5M S, another 1m rootball on E side of trail. 1.5m mossy rock to the W, across the trail from the northern rootball.
5	Facing N from point 5.	Facing W from point 5.	N 43.94435 W 71.38294 Elev(m) 930	Trail curves around a paper birch growing out of E side of trail with very exposed rootball. 2 rocks 1 foot in diameter right below rootball. 3M long log S of the birch, lying parallel to the E side of the trail.
6	Facing S from point 6.	Facing W from point 6.	N 43.94230 W 71.38168 Elev(m)	Point is beside 8" DBH yellow birch (to E of point). 10M S, 18" DBH yellow birch on W side of trail.

Please survey this route in order, beginning with point 1.
