
Mountain Birdwatch 2.0

Route 150: Slide Mt., NY

150 Slide Mountain



Pt #	Picture 1	Picture 2	GPS ¹	Description
1	Facing E from pt 1	Facing W from pt 1	N 41.9995 W 74.38114 Elev (m) 1110	30m W. (uphill) on trail is a huge striated boulder (~ 3m tall and 5m2) + 50m W. (uphill) the trail climbs beside another boulder of even greater magnitude. MBW tag in 25cm balsam fir on N. side of trail. This tree has a red trail marker on E. side. 5m W. is a 50cm older yellow birch snag on S. side of trail. 7m E. of point a 25cm dbh (diameter at breast height) fir has fallen across the trail from S. to N. and is suspended over the trail at an angle ~ 1.5-2m off the ground. 12 m SE on trail is a ~6m high rock cliff that requires use of both hands to climb down.
2	Facing E from pt 2	Facing W from pt 2	N 41.99888 W 74.38407 Elev (m) 1225	Point is at bend in trail. 5m E. trail drops precipitously down near vertical rocky ledge ~3m, first sneaking past a 1m high & 2m2 boulder which takes up most of the trail. MBW tag in 25cm dbh Balsam fir on S. side of trail-on outside of the bend as the trail turns NW.
3	Facing S from pt 3	Facing N from pt 3	N 41.99971 W 74.38686 Elev (m) 1245	Point is 15m S. of a lookout point on E. side of trail. MBW tag in 30cm dbh balsam fir on W. side of trail. This fir also has red foot trail marker on N. side. A diagonal water bar is in the trail .5m S. of the point. Trail is very flat at the point.
4	Facing E from pt 4	Facing W from pt 4	N 42.00023 W 74.3898 Elev (m) 1228	MBW tag in 15cm dbh fir on N. side of trail. Just behind this fir ~1m N. off trail is a 40cm dbh snag ~3m tall. Trail is solid rock at point and 2m W., then stepping down .5m to broken rock and gravel.
5	Facing W from pt 5	Facing E from pt 5	N 42.00040 W 74.3928 Elev (m) 1196	MBW tag in 15cm dbh balsam fir on S side of trail. Decomposing stump .5m high just beside the fir to the E. on S. side of trail, .5m W. of point, a 2m long snag runs along the S. side of the trail. A ridged gravely bedrock descends gradually beside the snag, making the trail substrate.
6	Facing E from pt 6	Facing W from pt 6	N 42.00103 W 74.39569 Elev (m) 1196	MBW tag in 40cm dbh balsam fir with one vertical scar running the length of the trunk and a stunted crown that splays off to the W. This tree is on N. side of trail. 3m E, a 40cm dbh paper birch is growing on the N. side of trail. One 10cm diameter branch extends over the trail diagonally to the NW.
