## **Mountain Birdwatch 2.0**


Route 166: Burnt Mountain, VT

Hike Duration/Difficulty: ~2.5 miles, 1.5 hours

Route/Trail Access: Take Brooks Road to Gore Road east of Barre, VT. Drive up Gore Road until the road becomes private with landowner vehicle access only. As of 2011, the only obvious parking area is marked "no parking"- I knocked on a neighbor's door and she ended up inviting me to park in her driveway. Hike along Gore Road, past (closed) gates indicating a conservation easement. About 650 meters before point 3, the road ends at a clearing. Continue straight through the clearing over a fallen tree to an unmarked trail. Point 1 is at the end of this trail. Note that the conservation easement sign indicates that no camping is allowed in the area; this would be a good candidate for a morning hike.

| 3   | Facing E from Pt 3 | Facing W from Pt 3 | N<br>44.20811<br>W<br>72.34102<br>Elev(m)<br>785 | Point is at a washed-out area with 1m long rock sunk flat in the trail at the point. Hobble bush to north of the trail is leaning over away from the trail. Trail widens slightly at point, then narrows ~1m on either side. Broken paper birch on north side of trail. To the north, a Y-shaped paper birch (see picture). There is a 30 cm long white rock in the trail to the east of the point. |
