

Mountain Birdwatch 2.0

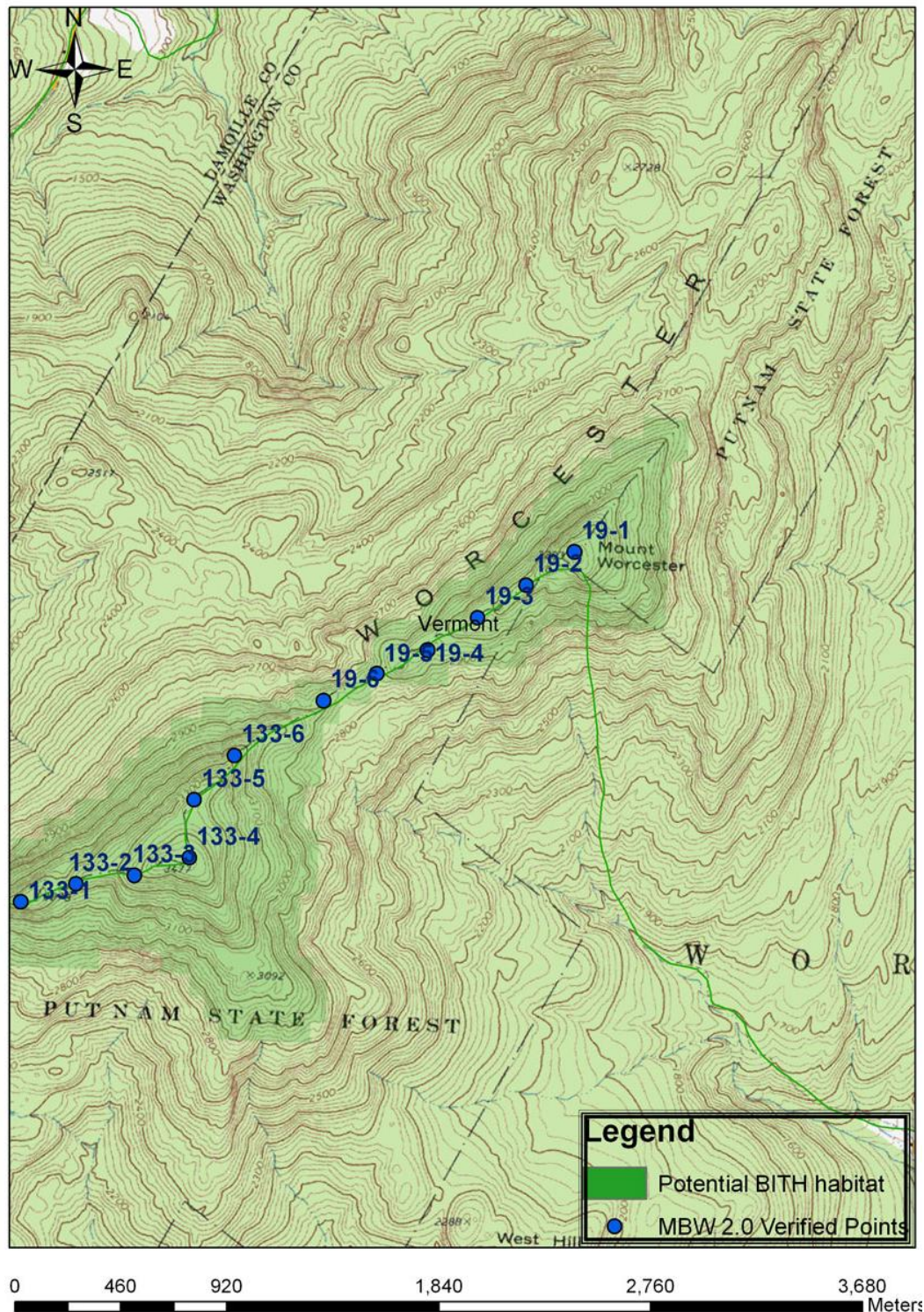
Route 19: Worcester, VT













Hike Duration/Difficulty: 3.5 hours

Route/Trail Access: Worcester Trail, 5 miles. From Worcester Village, left on Minister Brook Rd. Right at 4 corners at Hampshire Hill Rd. Continue straight, bearing left on Mountain Rd to trail parking (4.10 mi. from village). Sometimes steep trail.

1	 Facing E from pt 1.	 Facing W from pt 1.	N 44.44345 W 72.59213 Elev(m) 978	Point just at the Mt Worcester sign. Tree marked with a double blaze. In woods 10 meters before open rock.
2	 Facing E from pt 2.	 Facing W from pt 2.	N 44.44207 W 72.59467 Elev(m) 943	Vista to N of trail coming from pt 1. Point @ blaze. Peak of uphill, then level going towards Pt 3. Steep downhill to R. 3m tall snag at point.
3	 Facing E from pt 3.	 Facing W from pt 3.	N 44.44070 W 72.59724 Elev(m) 931	Point at large flat rock in trail with moose pellets, about 5 m long. Partial vista to S. Facing S, look L for blue marker.
4	 Facing S from pt 4.	 Facing W from pt 4.	N 44.43937 W 72.59991 Elev(m) 896	Trail bends R after point. Point @ mossy rock on the trail. Blue marker @ corner. Straight, mostly flat approach. Large dead tree to L of trail @ bend just after point.
5	 Facing N from pt 5.	 Facing W from pt 5.	N 44.43835 W 72.60261 Elev(m) 879	10 M past clearing to L. Blue trail marker 2 m past point on spruce. Living birch leaning over trail 2 m past point.
6	 Facing N from pt 6.	 Facing S from pt 6.	N 44.43722 W 72.60543 Elev(m) 875	Flat walk through ferns on approach. Very mossy downed stump past point 4m to left of trail. Oddly bent balsam over trail ~ 3 m before point.

Please survey this route in order, beginning with point 1.
