Mountain Birdwatch 2.0


Route 54: Hunger, VT

Hike Duration/Difficulty: 2 to 2.5 hours- strenuous.

Route/Trail Access: From Route 100 north out of Waterbury, pass Ben and Jerry's factory and take the next right turn on Guptil Road. In about a mile, turn right on Kneeland or Kneeland Flats Road. Follow that road to a T (~3 miles?). Turn right on Sweet Road. Look for a parking lot on the right after a mile or two. Take the Waterbury Trail for 2 miles, then at trail intersection, head right (south) towards White Rock. Points are along the trail between Mount Hunger and White Rock.

1	Facing E from pt 1.	Facing W from pt 1.	N 44.39486 W 72.64732 Elev(m) 1008	Large (15-20 cm dbh*) red spruce to N of point. Point at flat section in trail, 5m west of 2m tall stump 7 cm dbh pointing E into trail. Blue blaze on 4cm dbh balsam at point.
2	Facing N from pt 2.	Facing W from pt 2.	N 44.39372 W 72.6501 Elev(m) 972	Point at bottom (just West of) of steep, rocky, root-y descent about 4 meters high. Point 3m before (East of) cut log serving as a bridge over muddy trail. Blue blaze- look East from point- on elevated spruce.
3	Facing N from pt 3.	Facing E from pt 3.	N 44.39162 W 72.65147 Elev(m) 935	At flat section of trail. Blue blazes on birch snag 1 m S of point, blue blaze on S side of balsam 2.5m N of point. At point, paper birch entangled with dead conifer. 2.5 meter high stump to West of point.
4	Facing E from pt 4.	Facing W from pt 4.	N 44.38951 W 72.65266 Elev(m) 950	Point immediately before forest opens up to rocky alpine zone. Dead red spruce stump- 2.5 meters high- at point. Point at muddy area in trail, 7 meters west of spruce tree with its base in the trail and its trunk curving south out of the trail. This tree has a blue blaze on its southeast side.

*dbh = diameter at breast height.Please survey this route in order, beginning with point 1.
