
## Mountain Birdwatch 2.0 Route 66: Sandwich, NH

Hike Duration/Difficulty: 2.5 hr.

**Route/Trail Access:** Take Bennett Street trail all the way to point 1. Alternative trail descriptions and interactive maps at <u>http://home.earthlink.net/~ellozy/waterville.html</u>. Gleason Trail not maintained; lots of blow downs.

**Camping:** Wilderness area, camping 200 ft from trail and few open areas along trail.

Pt #	Picture 1	Picture 2	GPS <sup>1</sup>	Description
1	Facing E from pt 1.	Facing W from pt 1.	N 43.89702 W 71.47724 Elev(m) 876	3 dead trees lying across trail, spaced about a foot apart. All rest on another dead tree running parallel to the trail. A rock is underneath the center tree.
2	Facing E from pt 2.	Facing W from pt 2.	N 43.89811 W 71.48005 Elev(m) 924	From NE side of trail, 2 dead trees lie on ground. One projects across trail and one is sawn off at the edge of the trail. Farther E down trail is a log jutting diagonally into the trail with higher end closest to trail and lower end on NE side of trail. It is crossed by a thinner dead tree making an X.
3	Facing E from pt 3.	Facing W from pt 3.	N 43.89923 W 71.48268 Elev(m) 938	A 6m fallen tree runs parallel to trail on NE side, rests on a larger, shorter dead tree just jutting into the trail. A birch snag stands straight next to a shorter dead log. Canopy opens up after this snag to the SE.
4	Facing E from pt 4.	Facing W from pt 4.	<b>N</b> 43.89967 <b>W</b> 71.48575 <b>Elev(m)</b> 970	To E 5m, a 1ft DBH* log across trail at 1.5m above ground. At point, a log lies across trail N-S. To N, a 4m standing snag beside trail.
5	Facing N from pt 5.	Facing S from pt 5.	N 43.90014 W 71.48881 Elev(m) 1058	2 dead logs across trail at this point. 2 snags flank trail to N & S 1m to the E of point, and also 1m to W, creating a box of 4 snags around point.
6	Facing E from pt 6.	Facing W from pt 6.	<b>N</b> 43.90069 <b>W</b> 71.49179 <b>Elev(m)</b> 1114	At point, a 3m section of dead tree lies perpendicular to N edge of trail. To S, a spruce is broken and leaning 4m above ground (will fall soon). The remains of a blue paint blaze are barely visible on a fir 5m W. This point is left (W) on the Bennett Street Trail after the Gleason Trail rejoins it near the summit.
