

Mountain Birdwatch 2.0

Route 73: Magalloway, NH



Hike Duration/Difficulty: 2 minutes to 73-2, 1 hour to 73-6.


Route/Trail Access: Coot Trail. (At very end of parking area, trail is labeled.) Take Hwy 3 to Magalloway Road eastbound; turn right on Magalloway Mountain Road, follow to a dead end and trailhead.

Note: Point 1 discontinued after 2013. Begin survey at point 2.

2	 Facing E from pt 2.	 Facing W from pt 2.	N 45.06941 W 71.17255 Elev (m) 789	Point is right at the head of the Bobcat Trail, 40m W of the parking area on Magalloway Mountain Road.
3	 Facing N from pt 3.	 Facing E from pt 3.	N 45.06743 W 71.17045 Elev (m) 838	Log across trail with scratch marks. 2 large rocks north of log with dead tree leaning from rock to rock, with highest point of leaning tree beginning at northernmost rock. Scratch marks on rock as well. Point at upper section of 1 st steep climb after cabin.
4	 Facing N from pt 4.	 Facing S from pt 4.	N 45.06562 W 71.16843 Elev (m) 907	Uphill, the trail makes a shallow S-curve around 2 paper birches on E side of trail. 3 waterbars within 15m – point is between the highest and middle waterbar. To W beside trail, a 20m tall birch snag.
5	 Facing N from pt 5.	 Facing S from pt 5.	N 45.06371 W 71.16672 Elev (m) 983	15m S, up trail, is a 1.5m tall stump on W side of trail. 15M N, down trail, trail curves away to the right/east. 5m N, 5cm dbh paper birch curves toward trail in 2013. Orange flagging on this tree.
6	 Facing E from pt 6.	 Facing W from pt 6.	N 45.06308 W 71.16309 Elev (m) 1026	Fire tower 60m SE, visible from point. 10M to SE, pass into summit area marked by open grassy clearing with cabins. Point is beside the largest fir in the vicinity, on the S side of the trail – 15” diameter at breast height (dbh).

Please survey this route in order, beginning with point 2.
