SUMMER SEASON 1975 June-Julu

In Green Mountain Audubon's booklet Birds of Vermont, Robert Spear lists 182 possible nesting species in Vermont; this summer's Bird Records have reports of 173, or 90% of the possible species. The report is highlighted with some unusual appearances and the confirmation of some suspected breeders.

Top stars of the season were the ACADIAN FLYCATCHER (first Vermont report in 71 years) and the KENTUCKY WARBLER (first Vermont report in 70 years). The Acadian Flycatcher (common in the south but not here) was reported by Whit Nichols in Marlboro on June 27. The Kentucky Warbler (also a southern bird but more inclined to wander) was located in Manchester on June 16 by William J. Norse (previous state reports are from Taftsville, June 19, 1885; and Lunenburg, May 30, 1905). The last Acadian Flycatcher reported in Vermont was a breeding pair in Bennington in 1904.

Also most unusual was the YELLOW RAIL located by Frank Oatman in the Newport marshes on June 3, the first ever reported to Records of Vermont Birds. Also noteworthy are the reports of Golden-winged Warbler; Orchard Oriole; and the White-winged Crossbill singing in Cuttingsville on June 15.

Included herein are records confirming the Vermont breeding of the following species: Black-backed Three-toed Woodpecker; Canada Jay; Yellow-throated Vireo; Henslow's Sparrow; and Lincoln's Sparrow. More reason to suspect breeding of Cape May Warbler, Tennessee Warbler and Bay-breasted Warbler piles up here, with no positive confirmation yet. Expansion of other species continues: Turkey Vultures have been sighted so often that breeding should be carefully watched for; an encouraging 7 Bald Eagles were reported; Ravens continue to expand; Mockingbirds are settling in and perhaps Carolina Wrens will soon begin to.

Vermont's weather cooperated to produce a relatively good summer. June was 1.2 degrees above normal with a total precipitation of about 1 inch below normal; July was the second hottest in 9 years with one day recording 98 degrees!
