Vermont Bird Records Committee Report 1988

The Vermont Bird Records Committee met 19 November 1988 for its yearly meeting to review rare bird reports. The Committee's function is to establish guidelines for the reporting of rarities and to review and verify records of rarities for inclusion in the state bird list. The Committee's recommendations are followed in the publication of records in Records of Vermont Birds. The Bird Records Committee is a standing committee of the Vermont Audubon Council and consists of the managing editor of the Records of Vermont Birds, the seasonal editors of the Records of Vermont Birds, and the regional editors for Vermont for American Birds.

Jeremy Coleman, new RVB editor joined the committee, and Wayne Petersen and Simon Perkins, two of the editors for the new New England region, represented American Birds.

The Committee and the editors of the Records of Vermont Birds express their appreciation to the many Vermont birders who report to the Records of Vermont Birds and to the birders who have taken the time and trouble to fill out detailed Bird Verification Reports. These reports add greatly to Vermont's data base on birds. Careful recording of the details of plumage and identification are necessary.

SPECIES FOR WHICH DETAILED REPORTS ARE REQUIRED (Write to the Vermont Institute of Natural Science for Bird Verification Report forms (BVRs) or for Rare Species Nesting Report forms (RNRs).

1) A verification report is required for any species not included on the Vermont Daily Field Card (reproduced elsewhere in this issue) and for any species significantly outside the usual dates of occurrence in Vermont.

Note: add to field card - Glossy Ibis 4D-6A, Purple Sandpiper 10D-11C, Stilt Sandpiper 7D-10B, Little Gull 8B-1A.

Vermont Bird Records Committee Report 1989

The Vermont Bird Records Committee met 18 November 1989 for its yearly meeting to review rare bird reports. The Committee's function is to establish guidelines for the reporting of rarities and to review and verify records of rarities for inclusion in the state bird list. The Committee's recommendations are followed in the publication of records in <u>Records of</u> <u>Vermont Birds</u>. The Bird Records Committee is a standing committee of the Vermont Audubon Council and consists of the managing editor of the <u>Records of</u> <u>Vermont Birds</u>, the seasonal editors of the <u>Records of</u> <u>Vermont Birds</u>, and the regional editors for Vermont for American Birds.

Charlie Duncan, one of the editors for the New England region, represented <u>American Birds</u>.

The Committee and the editors of the <u>Records of Ver-</u> <u>mont Birds</u> express their appreciation to the many Vermont birders who report to the <u>Records of Vermont</u> <u>Birds</u> and to the birders who have taken the time and trouble to fill out detailed reports on rare species. These reports add greatly to Vermont's data base on birds. Careful recording of the details of plumage and identification are necessary.

SPECIES FOR WHICH DETAILED REPORTS ARE REQUIRED (Write to the Vermont Institute of Natural Science for Rare Species Documentation forms (RSDs) or for Rare Species Nesting Report forms (RNRs).



Records of Vermont Birds

Vermont Bird Records Committee Report 1990

The Vermont Bird Records Committee met 3 November 1990 for its yearly meeting to review rare bird reports. The committee's function is to establish guidelines for the reporting of rarities and to review and evaluate records of rarities for their acceptability by future researchers and for inclusion in the state bird list. The Committee's recommendations are followed in the publication of records in <u>Records of Vermont Birds</u>. The Bird Records Committee is a standing committee of the Vermont Audubon Council and consists of the managing editor of the <u>Records of Vermont Birds</u>, the seasonal editors of the <u>Records of Vermont Birds</u>, and the regional editors for Vermont for <u>American Birds</u>.

Charlie Duncan and Wayne Petersen, editors for the New England region, represented <u>American Birds</u>.

The Committee and the editors of the <u>Records of Vermont</u> <u>Birds</u> express their appreciation to the many Vermont birders who report to the <u>Records of Vermont Birds</u> and to the birders who have taken the time and trouble to fill out detailed reports on rare species. These reports add greatly to Vermont's data base on birds. Careful recording of the details of plumage and identification are necessary.

<u>SPECIES FOR WHICH DETAILED REPORTS ARE REQUIRED</u> (Write to the Vermont Institute of Natural Science for Rare Species Documentation forms (RSD's) or for Rare Species Nesting Report forms (RNR's).

1) A documentation report is required for any species not included on the Vermont Daily Field Card (reproduced elsewhere in this issue) and for any species significantly outside the usual dates of occurrence in Vermont.

2) In addition, RSD's are required in all seasons for: Golden Eagle Black-backed Woodpecker Common Barn-Owl (outside the Northeast Long-eared Owl Kingdom) Three-toed Woodpecker Yellow-breasted Chat

3) RNR's are requested on the following species (which are rare nesters in Vermont) <u>if the species is observed</u> <u>in the proper breeding habitat during the breeding</u> <u>season</u> (exceptions or special cases follow each species name in parentheses): Pied-billed Grebe

Least Bittern (except for the West Rutland Marsh, Dead Creek and Missisquoi)

Vermont Bird Records Committee Report 1991

The Vermont Bird Records Committee met on 26 October 1991 for its yearly meeting to review rare bird reports. The committee's function is to establish guidelines for the reporting of rarities and to review and evaluate records of rarities for their acceptability by future researchers and for inclusion in the state bird list. The Committee's recommendations are followed in the publication of records in <u>Records of Vermont Birds</u>. The Bird Records Committee is a standing committee of the Vermont Audubon Council and consists of the managing editor of the <u>Records of Vermont Birds</u>, the seasonal editors of the <u>Records of Vermont Birds</u>, and the regional editors for Vermont for <u>American Birds</u>.

The Committee and the editors of the <u>Records of Vermont</u> <u>Birds</u> express their appreciation to the many Vermont birders who report to the <u>Records of Vermont Birds</u> and to the birders who have taken the time and trouble to fill out detailed reports on rare species. These reports add greatly to Vermont's data base on birds. Careful recording of the details of plumage and identification are necessary.

<u>SPECIES FOR WHICH DETAILED REPORTS ARE REQUIRED</u> (Write to the Vermont Institute of Natural Science for Rare Species Documentation forms (RSD's) or for Rare Species Nesting Report forms (RNR's).







MEMORANDUM REGARDING RARE SPECIES DOCUMENTATION

The Vermont Bird Records Committee (VBRC) emphasizes the importance of descriptive and detailed documentation for all rarities, rare nesting species and out-of-season species.

The committee is anxious to involve all Vermont birders in the process of producing as accurate a Vermont state list as possible. This list and all documentation must be credible to future ornithologists who will use the material for research. Suggestions for improving the reporting/voting process will be gratefully received by the committee.

It is frustrating for both the observer and the committee to have a tantalizing sighting of a rare species not listed due to insufficient details.

Writing down the salient points of identification, talking into a tape recorder, making a quick sketch or taking a photograph at the time of observation are ways to help with accurate recounting later.

The Rare Species Documentation (RSD) form is both for filing the reports and is intended as a guide for the information needed. After completing the first page, reporters may prefer to write the description of the bird on a separate sheet of paper but checking the form for details requested.

Again the VBRC expresses its thanks to all observers who have contributed valuable information to the Vermont state list thus far.

Vermont Bird Records Committee Report 1992

The Vermont Bird Records Committee met on 7 November 1992 for its yearly meeting to review rare bird reports. The committee's function is to establish guidelines for the reporting of rarities and to review and evaluate records of rarities for their acceptability by future researchers and for inclusion in the state bird list. The Committee's recommendations are followed in the publication of records in Records of Vermont Birds. The Bird Records Committee consists of the managing editor of the Records of Vermont Birds, the seasonal editors of the Records of Vermont Birds, and the regional editors for Vermont for American Birds.

The Committee and the editors of the Records of Vermont Birds express their appreciation to the many Vermont birders who report to the <u>Records of Vermont Birds</u> and to the birders who have taken the time and trouble to fill out detailed reports on rare species. These reports add greatly to Vermont's data base on birds. Careful recording of the details of plumage and identification are necessary.

SPECIES FOR WHICH DETAILED REPORTS ARE REQUIRED (Write to the Vermont Institute of Natural Science for Rare Species Documentation forms (RSD's) or for Rare Species Nesting Report forms (RNR's).

1) A documentation report is required for any species not included on the Vermont Daily Field Card and for any species significantly outside the usual dates of occurrence in Vermont.

2) In addition, RSD's are required in all seasons for:

Golden Eagle Barn Owl Long-eared Owl Three-toed Woodpecker

Black-backed Woodpecker (outside the Northeast Kingdom) Sedge Wren Orange-crowned Warbler Yellow-breasted Chat

The Vermont Bird Records Committee met on 4 November 1995 for its yearly meeting to review rare bird reports. The Committee's function is to establish guidelines for the reporting of rarities and to review and evaluate records of rarities for their acceptability by future researchers and for inclusion in the state bird list. The Committee's recommendations are followed in the publication of records in *Records of Vermont Birds*. The Bird Records Committee consists of the managing editor of *Records of Vermont Birds*, the seasonal editors of *Records of Vermont Birds*, and the regional editors for Vermont for *American Birds*.

The Committee and the editors of *Records of Vermont Birds* express their appreciation to the many Vermont birders who report to *Records of Vermont Birds* and to the birders who have taken the time and trouble to fill out detailed reports on rare species. These reports add greatly to Vermont's data base on birds. Careful recording of the details of plumage and identification are necessary.

SPECIES FOR WHICH DETAILED REPORTS ARE REQUIRED

Write to the Vermont Institute of Natural Science for Rare Species Documentation forms (RSD's) or for Rare Species Nesting Report forms (RNR's).

- 1) A documentation report is required for any species not included on the Vermont Daily Field Card and for any species significantly outside the usual dates of occurrence in Vermont.
- 2) In addition, RSD's are required in all seasons for:



The Bird Records Committee consists of the managing editor and seasonal editors of RVB and the Vermont regional editors for *ABA Field Notes*.

The Committee and the editors of RVB express their gratitude to the birders who have documented rare bird sightings with detailed reports. These reports add greatly to the data and general knowledge of the birds of Vermont. To obtain Rare Species Documentation forms (RSDs), or Rare Species Nesting Report forms (RNRs) write to the Vermont Institute of Natural Science, 27023 Church Hill Rd., Woodstock, VT 05091.

Species for Which Detailed Reports are Required

A documentation report is required for any species not included on the Vermont Daily Field Card or for any species significantly outside the usual dates of occurrence in Vermont.

In addition, RSDs are required in all seasons for: Golden Eagle, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Three-toed Woodpecker, Yellow-breasted Chat, Black-backed Woodpecker (outside Northeast Kingdom), Sedge Wren, and Orange-crowned Warbler.





Vermont Bird Records Committee 1999 Report

he Vermont Bird Records Committee met on November 6, 1999, for its annual review of rare bird reports. The Committee's responsibilities are to establish guidelines for the documentation of rare birds, and to review reports for inclusion in the state bird list and for use by future researchers.

The Committee's recommendations are reported in the publication the *Records of Vermont Birds* (RVB). The Bird Records Committee consists of the managing editor and seasonal editors of RVB and the Vermont regional editors for *ABA Field Notes*.

The Committee and the editors of RVB express their gratitude to the birders who have documented rare bird sightings with detailed reports. These reports add greatly to the data and general knowledge of the birds RNRs are requested for the following species (which are rare nesters in Vermont) if the species is observed in proper breeding habitat during the breeding season (exceptions or special cases follow each species name in parentheses): **Pied-billed Grebe, Least Bittern** (except for the West Rutland Marsh, Dead Creek Wildlife Management Area, and Missisquoi National Wildlife Refuge), **Great Egret** (between 15 May and 15 July), **Northern Shoveler, American Wigeon, Ringnecked Duck, Lesser Scaup, Osprey** (if nesting

of Vermont. To obtain Rare Species Documentation forms (RSDs), or Rare Species Nesting Report forms (RNRs) write to the Vermont Institute of Natural Science, 27023 Church Hill Rd., Woodstock, VT 05091.

Species for Which Detailed Reports are Required

A documentation report is required for any species not included on the Vermont Daily Field Card or for any species significantly outside the usual dates of occurrence in Vermont.



SPECIES FOR WHICH DETAILED REPORTS ARE REQUIRED

A documentation report is required for any species not included on the Vermont Daily Field Card or for any species significantly outside the usual dates of occurrence in Vermont.

In addition, RSDs are required in all seasons for: **Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Three-toed Woodpecker, Yellow-breasted Chat, Black-backed Woodpecker** (outside the Northeast Kingdom), **Sedge Wren, Orange –crowned Warbler, Ross's Goose** (away from Dead Creek), **Golden Eagle** (except during October & November), **Caspian Tern** (away from northern Lake Champlain. Any nesting report would need to be fully documented), **Sandhill Crane**, and **Clay-colored Sparrow**.


RSNRs are requested for the following species (which are rare nesters in Vermont) if the species is observed in proper breeding habitat during the breeding season (exceptions or special cases follow each species in parentheses): **Pied-billed Grebe, Least Bittern** (except for West Rutland Marsh, Dead Creek WMA, and Missisisquoi NWR), **Great Egret** (between 15 May and 15 July), **Northern Shoveler, American Wigeon, Ring-necked Duck, Lesser Scaup, Osprey** (where nesting evidence is observed except when seen on a platform), Bald Eagle (if nesting evidence is observed), Northern Harrier (outside the Champlain valley), Cooper's Hawk, (if nesting evidence is observed), Peregrine Falcon, Spruce Grouse, Sora (except in the Barton river Marshes, West Rutland Marsh, Dead Creek and Missisisquoi marshes), Upland Sandpiper, Short-eared Owl, Red-headed Woodpecker (if nesting is probable or confirmed), Gray Jay (outside the Northeast Kingdom), Loggerhead Shrike, Grasshopper Sparrow, Orchard Oriole (if nesting evidence is observed), Pine Grosbeak, Red Crossbill (if nesting is confirmed), and Mute Swan.


