Vermont Birds Records Committee 1998 Report

he Vermont Bird Records Committee met on November 7, 1998, for its annual review of rare bird reports. The Committee's responsibilities are to establish guidelines for the documentation of rare birds, and to review reports for inclusion in the state bird list and for use by future researchers. The Committee's recommendations are reported in the publication the *Records of Vermont Birds* (RVB). The Bird Records Committee consists of the managing editor and seasonal editors of RVB and the Vermont regional editors for *ABA Field Notes*.

The Committee and the editors of RVB express their gratitude to the birders who have documented rare bird sightings with detailed reports. These reports add greatly to the data and general knowledge of the birds of Vermont. To obtain Rare Species Documentation forms (RSDs), or Rare Species Nesting Report forms (RNRs) write to the Vermont Institute of Natural Science, 27023 Church Hill Rd., Woodstock, VT 05091.

Species for Which Detailed Reports are Required

A documentation report is required for any species not included on the Vermont Daily Field Card or for any species significantly outside the usual dates of occurrence in Vermont.

In addition, RSDs are required in all seasons for: Golden Eagle, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Threetoed Woodpecker, Yellow-breasted Chat, Blackbacked Woodpecker (outside Northeast Kingdom), Sedge Wren, and Orange-crowned Warbler. RNRs are requested for the following species (which are rare nesters in Vermont) if the species is observed in proper breeding habitat during the breeding season (exceptions or special cases follow each species name in parentheses): Pied-billed Grebe, Least Bittern (except for the West Rutland Marsh, Dead Creek Wildlife Management Area, and Missisquoi National Wildlife Refuge), Great Egret (between 15 May and 15 July), Northern Shoveler, American Wigeon, Ring-necked Duck, Lesser Scaup, Osprey (if nesting evidence is observed, except when seen on a platform), Bald Eagle (if nesting evidence is observed), Northern Harrier (outside the Champlain Valley), Cooper's Hawk (if nesting evidence is observed), Peregrine Falcon, Spruce Grouse, Sora (except the Barton River Marshes, West Rutland Marsh, Dead Creek and Missisquoi Marshes), Upland Sandpiper, Short-eared Owl, Red-headed Woodpecker (if nesting is probable or confirmed), Gray Jay (outside the Northeast Kingdom), Loggerhead Shrike, Grasshopper Sparrow, Orchard Oriole (if nesting evidence is observed), Pine Grosbeak, Red Crossbill (if confirmed breeding), and Mute Swan.

FIRST STATE RECORDS

PARASITIC JAEGER (Stercorarius parasiticus) — one dark morph, off Elm Point, Lake Champlain, Addison, Addison Cty., 1-7 November 1997. Theodore G. Murin, Scott W. Morrical, Frederick A. Pratt et al. A similar individual seen at this same location 7-8 December 1997 could well have been the same bird. A previous report off Georgia shore, Franklin Cty., 26 October, 1987 by Richard B. Lavallee was accepted as hypothetical.

FISH CROW (Corvus ossifragus) – two or three, Red Rocks Park, South Burlington, Chittenden Cty., 3-31 May 1998. T.G. Murin, S.W. Morrical. Confirmed nesting. A previous report from Brattleboro, Windham Cty., 8 April, 1992 by Tom Maloney and John Dunn was accepted as hypothetical.

AMERICAN WHITE PELICAN


