hat is so rare as a day in June? For Vermont birders it would be a **dry** day in June. Rainfall occurred on all but three days in the month making it one of the rainiest Junes of recent times.

This dismal scene continued into July resulting in more flooding in the Ripton area. In spite of all the cool and gloomy weather a bright spot appeared in the discovery of a **FORK-TAILED FLY-**

**CATCHER**, a **2nd State Record**, that had taken up residence in Ferrisburgh along the Little Otter Creek.



Thanks to the sharp eyes of Bea Guyette scores of birders from far and wide were entertained and delighted by the bird's appearance. Other notable rarities included Claycolored Sparrow found in Grand Isle and Sedge Wren seen and heard in Bridport.

A **Pied-billed Grebe** adult was observed with four chicks at the South Bay Wildlife Management Area in Coventry confirming nesting there. Nesting behavior was also observed for **Green-wing Teal** in West Bolton and **Caspian Tern** were accepted as probable nesters on Young Island.

## LOONS THROUGH WATERFOWL

The **Common Loon** breeding season was successful with 36 of the 38 pairs producing 45 chicks that had survived through August. Discarded fishing line as well as the ingestion of lead sinkers continue to result in loon mortality.

We will not know if the oiling of **Double-crested Cormorant** eggs in 1999 had the hoped for results of lessening their population until 2002.

### RAPTORS THROUGH GULLS

Osprey numbers held at last year's total of 60 young fledged. Perhaps this was due to the cold, rainy spring and dismal June weather. **Peregrine Falcon** numbers were at 23 pairs with 18 successful sites. Forty plus chicks were produced from these sites.

The **Common Tern** continues to do well with 160 pairs raising 82 chicks. However the **Black Tern** population has declined to 63 pairs as compared to 100 in 1999. Weather again may be a factor in this decline since water levels were high, flooding out potential nest sites.

A sighting of two adult **Bald Eagle** with an immature at Moore Reservoir on the Connecticut River gives us hope of finding a nesting pair in Vermont. **Upland Sandpiper** appear to be breeding at the Berlin airport.

#### **DOVES THROUGH HOUSE SPARROWS**

A group of soaring raptors is called a kettle.

Two **Sedge Wrens** were found occupying the edge of a hayfield in Bridport along Happy Valley Road near the transfer station. This shy denize of the fields was more easily heard than seen but with patience a brief view was the reward.

A family of **Screech Owls** was observed in Panton and the presence of a **Red-bellied Woodpecker** in Colchester during the summer raises hopes for the first confirmed nesting for this species in Vermont. **Red-headed Woodpeckers** continue to nest in Bridport. Two adult **Gray Jays** with two juveniles were found in Victory Bog. A **Fish Crow** was unconfirmed from the Williston Rd. area in South Burlington continuing hopes that we may soon find them nesting in the area. A **Cape May Warbler** heard singing in Orange June 1 through

the 17th was also notable and bears watching.

The **Bicknell's Thrush** is a bird of special concern with its habitat both here and on its wintering grounds threatened. As in the past the greatest number (7) were found on Mt. Mansfield. In addition 17 other peaks in northern Vermont hosted this at risk species.

Mt. Mansfield provided excitement with both **Tennessee** and **Bay-breasted Warblers** banded at 3850 feet. A pair of **Orchard Orioles** chose to nest within 30 feet of a pair of **Baltimore Orioles** at McCuen Slang in Addison.
