## NOTABLE STATE RECORDS, SECOND THROUGH TENTH

PACIFIC LOON (*Gavia pacifica*) – one adult non-breeding, 23 October 2004, Champlain Bridge, Addison, Addison Cty., John Sutton, Dwight Cargill, Steve Antell. Second State Record.

COMMON EIDER (<u>Somateria mollissima</u>) – 15 males, 5 November 2003, Charlotte Town Beach, Charlotte, Chittenden Cty., Susanne Wetmore, Greta Taber. Tenth State Record.

LONG-TAILED JAEGER (<u>Stercorarius longicaudus</u>) – two adults, 23 August 2004, Lake Champlain off Grand Isle, Grand Isle Cty,, David J. Hoag. Sixth State Record.

POMARINE JAEGER (<u>S. pomarinus</u>) – one, 17 August 2004, Lake Champlain off Grand Isle, Grand Isle Cty., D.J. Hoag. Eighth State Record.

ATLANTIC PUFFIN (*Fratercula arctica*) – one, juvenile or basic plumaged adult, 27 November 2003, Burlington Waterfront, Chittenden Cty., Robert D. Scott. Second State Record.

NELSON'S SHARP-TAILED SPARROW (Ammodramus nelsoni) – one adult, 3 October 2004, South end Shelburne Bay, Shelburne, Chittenden Cty., Theodore G. Murin, Allan M. Strong. Tenth accepted record overall and the first since this species was split from Saltmarsh Sharp-tailed Sparrow in 1998. Seven historical records dating back to 1917 and two accepted reports from Steve Antell of birds at the mouth of the

Winooski River in 1980 and 1985 were likely of this species. The Committee agrees that this bird was probably of the subspecies *nelsoni*.

NELSON'S SHARP-TAILED SPARROW (<u>A. nelsoni</u>) – one, 16 October 2004, South end Shelburne Bay, Shelburne, Chittenden Cty., Frederick A. Pratt, Eleanor B. Pratt. Second record post-split. Possibly of the subspecies *alterus*.

NELSON'S SHARP-TAILED SPARROW (<u>A. nelsoni</u>) – two, 18 October 2004, South end Shelburne Bay, Shelburne, Chittenden Cty., Richard B. Lavallee, Dennis Abbott. Third record post-split. One of the birds appeared to be *nelsoni* and the other *alterus*, possibly the same bird as the Pratt sighting above.

## REPORTS NOT ACCEPTED

EARED GREBE (<u>Podiceps nigricollis</u>) – two in flight over water, 30 October 2003, Grand Isle, Grand Isle Cty., details insufficient to rule out Horned Grebe.

WHITE-TAILED KITE (*Elanus leucurus*) - one, 29 March 2004, Herrick's Cove, Rockingham, Windham Cty., insufficient details; wing description is not consistent with White-tailed Kite.

HOARY REDPOLL (<u>Carduelis hornemanni</u>) – one, 11 January 2004, Vernon, Windham Cty., details insufficient to rule out Common Redpoll.

HOARY REDPOLL (<u>C. hornemanni</u>) – one, 17 January 2004, South Burlington, Chittenden Cty., details insufficient to rule out Common Redpoll.

### REPORTS NOT CONSIDERED

GREAT CORMORANT (*Phalacrocorax carbo*) – one, 18 April 2004, Ledyard Bridge across from Norwich, VT in Windsor Cty. Stefan Sturup. This bird was seen on the Connecticut River and (which is technically part of NH) when it was observed, so this record was not considered.
