2010 DECISIONS

FIRST STATE RECORDS

SWALLOW-TAILED KITE (<u>Elanoides forficatus</u>) – one, 26 May 1983, Middlebury, Addison Cty., Betty L. Rist, Marlene P. Dawson. Two reports with drawings. Previouly accepted by the VBRC on 9/11/83 and now judged to meet the requirements for First State Record. The report of this species by Anne Aversa and Barbara DeAngelis from Washington, Orange Cty., 3/28/86 and accepted by the VBRC on 9/13/86 is now the Second State Record. The committee voted not to accept an historical record from 1913. There had been no committee action on the 1913 record, which was published in Fortner et al. (1933) with no documentation.

ATLANTIC PUFFIN (<u>Fratercula arctica</u>) – one immature, 8-9 December 1960, Cold River Road, Rutland, Rutland Cty., Marshall Fish. Confirmation of identification based on a photograph in the Rutland Daily Herald of 12/10/60 and a write up by Allen H. Benton in the *Wilson Bulletin* 7/19/61. There had been no committee action on this record. A subsequent Second State Record was of a bird observed on the Burlington waterfront by Robert D. Scott 11/27/03, which was accepted by the committee 11/6/2004.

EURASIAN COLLARED DOVE (<u>Streptopelia decaocto</u>) – one, 25 November 2009, Norwich, Windsor Cty., John and Dianne Dunne, Spencer Hardy, Doug Hardy, m.ob. over several weeks. Definitive photographs by John Dunne.

GRAY CATBIRD (<u>Dumetella carolinesis</u>) – one, 12 December 2009, Rutland, Rutland Cty., S. Elliott.

REPORTS OF EXOTICS, ESCAPES, RELEASES

RUDDY SHELDUCK (<u>Tadorna ferruginea</u>) – one female, 5 November 2009, McKinley Ave., Rutland Town, Rutland Cty., Andrea Burke. First of this species reported in Vermont. Assumed to be an escapee.

RUDDY SHELDUCK (<u>T. ferruginea</u>) – one adult male, 30 May 2010, Shelburne Pond, Shelburne, Chittenden Cty., T.G. Murin. Photograph. Assumed to be an escapee.

REPORTS NOT ACCEPTED

ANHINGA (<u>Anhinga anhinga</u>) – one soaring, 30 May 2010, South Woodbury, Washington Cty., Does not rule out cormorant.

SWALLOW-TAILED KITE (<u>Elanoides forficatus</u>) – one, 26 April 1913, Waitsfield, Washington Cty., Not enough details for a First State Record.

KING RAIL (<u>Rallus elegans</u>) – one, August 1961, DCWMA, Addison, Addison Cty., Sight record only. No description of the bird.

KING RAIL (<u>R. elegans</u>) – one, September 1962, DCWMA, Addison, Addison Cty., Entry in Robert N. Spear, *Birds of Vermont*, now thought to be an error.

KING RAIL (<u>R. elegans</u>) – one, 17-18 May 1994, DCWMA, Addison, Addison Cty. Description of vocalization only. A tape of the call was lost by the VBRC. Without the tape this potential First State Record should not be accepted.

VEERY (<u>Catharus fuscescens</u>) – one singing male, 8 April 2010, Hartland Four Corners, Windsor Cty., Song only and not adequately described. Does not rule out other thrushes.

LINCOLN'S SPARROW (<u>Melospiza lincolnii</u>) – one, out-of-season, 26 March 2010, Northwood Park, Rutland, Rutland Cty. Photographs. Species of sparrow not determined. Thought perhaps to be Swamp Sparrow.
