#### SPRING MIGRATION '84

For the second spring in a row we were subjected to a very wet, cold and quite late spring. The winter of 1983-84 was cold early, with record-setting low temperatures in December, and colder than the average in January. February, however, was quite mild, and the ice began to break up in some places. This mild period was short lived, for March was extremely cold, with 25 of its 31 days below the average for the date, one day (3/12) as much as 27 below the mean. A low of -29 F was reached at Canaan. The feature of the month was the very heavy snowstorm of 3/13-14 which dumped varying amounts of snow around the state, heaviest in the mountains as usual, with 38 inches in Peru, and 42 inches in nearby Winhall, with only 8 to 10 inches in western Vermont and around Burlington.


April was a somewhat more normal month, temperature-wise. Only six days were below normal. The final two days of the month were the warmest, when temperatures climbed into the high-70's and low 80's, the warmest since early October 1983. It was, however, a wet month with considerable rain in some areas. Only minor amounts of snow fell, a welcome departure from recent Aprils.

This was the second consecutive cool wet May. The statewide average temperature of 51.4 F was 2-5 below normal, and made this the coolest May since 1974. Rainfall was frequent and heavy. Vermont averaged 8.93 inches of precipitation, more than five inches above normal and by far the wettest May since records began in 1895. The month's lowest temperatures were on the morning of 5/3, with some places as low as 20-21 F. The last sub-freezing temperature of the month occurred on the 17th and 18th. The heaviest rains fell from 5/28 into June, with many areas reporting destructive flooding, road washouts, etc.

What did this mean for the migration? Well - in March, migration was nearly non-existent in some areas, particularly in the mountains. Heavy ice which formed in the frigid early part of March prevented an early waterfowl movement. April, which was somewhat more seasonable came up with more or less normal arrival dates, but the cool wet weather in May caused late arrival of most of the insectivorous species. To illustrate this most graphically, on the Birdathon 5/19 the crack team of Ellison-Martin birded all over northern Vermont and missed the Red-eyed Vireo and Scarlet Tanager!

Woodland birds in general seemed to this observer to be generally scarce. This continues an ongoing trend of several years. The reasons are not altogether clear. Destruction of tropical forest winter habitat, and uncontrolled use of pesticides in Latin America and the West Indies may be a factor, but some of the affected species do not winter south of the United States. It is quite possible that some of the problems may originate right here. Acid rain, or more properly, polluted rain may be a factor. It is a situation which will bear watching.

Though the migration was essentially a late one, the warm weather of 4/28-30 produced a movement which



showed up primarily in the Champlain Valley and the southeast corner, and gave us several early dates. May 11 was another major movement day with many new arrivals at Hubbardton (CJF) and in the Brattleboro-Marlboro area (WDN, JJC). The bird-banders at VINS and many other observers considered 5/21-24 to be the major movement period, and this was when the bulk of breeding populations arrived.

The Vermont Hawkwatch, taken on the weekends of 4/14-15 and 4/21-22 produced only 614 hawks, down from 1983's 859. Unfavorable weather on those weekends was largely responsible.

Rarities are what everyone wants to hear about, and we had, as usual, a goodly number - YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT-HERON, GLOSSY IBIS, MUTE SWAN, EURASIAN WIGEON, possible FRANKLIN'S GULL, WHITE-EYED VIREO, "LAW-RENCE'S" WARBLER, YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT, BLUE GROSBEAK.

Others of interest were GREAT EGRET, Snowy Egret, Glaucous Gull, Iceland Gull, ORANGE-CROWNED WARBLER, Orchard Oriole.

Early dates were submitted for Green-backed Heron, Black Tern, Broad-winged Hawk, Common Nighthawk, Tree Swallow, Northern Oriole, Rough-winged Swallow, House Wren, Gray Catbird, Yellow Warbler, Blackburnian Warbler, Lincoln's Sparrow, White-crowned Sparrow, and Bobolink.

This year again, for the second year in a row, a strange looking teal was discovered (4/21) in the Leicester area (SSW). This bird (if it is the same bird) was at first believed to be a drake BAIKAL TEAL (Anas formosa) an eastern Palearctic species - in subadult plumage. However, after two seasons, it has still not assumed adult plumage, and there are a number of differences from the typical adult male. It is now believed to be a hybrid, probably between BAIKAL TEAL and some other species, and likely not of wild origin. One recalls the Ruddy Shelducks and Egyptian Geese which have occurred in northern Vermont in recent years.

The Vermont Birdathon was undertaken mostly on May 19th, and a total of 169 species and one hybrid were recorded. The top party list was 126 species by the team of George and Walter Ellison and Nancy Martin. The team of Lynn Erb, Deb Davis and Dwight Cargill recorded 117, and the team of Sally Laughlin, Betty Rist, and Henry Potter recorded 116. Four other parties topped 100.

I have included a large number of arrival dates in an attempt to show the different migration patterns in different areas of the state, both by latitude and by altitude. For most species the earliest arrival dates are at low altitudes and the latest at the high altitudes, both in the northern and southern parts of the state.


