SPRING MIGRATION 1985

1 March - 31 May WILLIAM J. NORSE, SEASONAL EDITOR

This spring was, on the whole, a welcome departure from recent ones. It was generally milder than average, and drier than recent ones, for the most part, until late May.

The winter of 1984-85 was generally less severe than last, and with mostly less snow. Oddly, there was much heavier snow in the north than in the southern half of the state, a departure from the normal pattern. A warm spell in late December melted most of the snow that had fallen and turned dirt roads into a muddy morass. January was persistantly cold, but was also quite dry. The latter half of February turned quite mild again, with another melting period similar to December.

March saw a return to cooler weather, and a couple of snow periods, on the fourth and fifth and again the accumulation was heavier in the north (Newport had 17 inches). Another snow period, around March 12 was also heavier in the north. Warmer weather the second half of the month brought bare ground to most of southern Vermont by month's end. Temperatures at

Burlington averaged 2-4° F above normal.

The generally dry weather pattern continued in April with precipitation 1 to 2.5 inches below the 30 year average. It was the driest April since 1971 and temperatures in Burlington averaged 1.6° F above normal. Snow in the early part of the month was on the light side, particularly in the south. The last 10 days or so were mild and dry with temperatures reaching the 70's and low 80's during the final week. By then, the snow was gone from everywhere but the higher mountains.

May brought continued dry weather to southern Vermont but near normal precipitation in the north. Alternating periods of cold and warm weather occurred later, with frequent thunder storms rumbling across the state. The month's temperature at Burlington was $.6^{\circ}$ F above the normal. The freeze on May 9 sent temperatures to as low as 17° F in the Northeast Kingdom.


By the period of May 10-13, temperatures had rebounded to the 80's generally, and approached the 90's in the south. The last part of May had considerably more rain, and much wind, many days being so windy that this observer found birding difficult.

What did this mean for the migration? Well in contrast to 1984, there was a good deal of movement in March. Warm weather in February had softened up the ice so that the Connecticut River and other waterways were generally open by mid-month, with a correspondingly good waterfowl movement. The warm weather produced a fine early April movement, especially on April 6, a day on which many good birds were seen, both early passerines and waterfowl.

Birds continued to pass through without much interruption and it was my impression that there was less migration spilling over into June than there had been in recent years. There was much wind the latter part of May, in fact it was windy most of the spring, and on into the summer.

The recent decline in woodland birds appeared to continue. This was not so noticeable at low elevations, but was quite noticeable in the Green Mountains (FAP,WJN). The acidity of the precipitation, of course, increases at higher altitudes. I noticed this spring a number of times, that such shy, secretive species as the Northern Waterthrush and the Catharus thrushes were coming boldly out into the open to feed along roads and trails, and high-feeding warblers such as Tennessee, Bay-breasted and Blackpoll, usually difficult to see in the spring, feeding in the open and near the ground. This may indicate stress due to some interruption in the food chain.

The warm periods through April and May produced corresponding "wave" days: April 6, 10, 13, 19, and 23 were frequently mentioned. May 6, 9, May 10-11 (likely the best movement days of the spring) and May 15, 20. The VINS banding station considered their best days to be May 10, with 25 new birds, 5 retraps of 15 species, and May 21 with 28 new and 4 retraps of 18 species.



As usual, we had a number of rarities: GLOSSY IBIS (several), MUTE SWAN, TUNDRA SWAN, a probable GREATER WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE GREATER WHOTE-FRONTED GOOSE HELLIED WOODPECKER, KENTUCKY WARBLER, hypothetical reports of BLUE GROSBEAK and LARK SPARROW (the latter would be a first state record).

Others of interest: <u>Great Egret</u> (twice), intergrade <u>Green-winged Teal</u> (with Eurasian race), several <u>Bald Eagles</u>, <u>Glaucous Gull</u>, hybrid <u>Glaucous X ? Gull</u>, <u>Iceland Gull</u>, <u>"Brewster's" Warbler</u> (several), <u>Orchard Oriole</u> (2), <u>Carolina Wren</u>.

Due, no doubt, to the unseasonably mild weather, a great many early dates were recorded, some seemingly bizarre, but a pattern is discernable and it will be interesting to see if the same pattern turns up in nearby states. The following were very early: Solitary Sandpiper, Whip-poor-will, Northern Flicker, Eastern Kingbird, Bank Swallow, Veery, Swainson's Thrush, Tennessee Warbler, Nashville Warbler, Yellow-rumped Warbler, Field Sparrow, White-crowned Sparrow, Swamp Sparrow. Many others were also earlier than usual.

The Birdathon was taken on 5/18 and 19. Saturday 5/18, it rained most everywhere, but it did not deter the indefatiguable birdathoners. Sunday 5/19 it rained early and the latter part of the day was very windy. Despite all this, a fine 185 species (and 1

hybrid) were seen. The team of George and Walter El- $^{-16-}$ lison, Nancy Martin and Dan Crook topped with 135 spe-The team of Chris & Doug Kibbe followed with 126, and Jeremy Coleman, Don Clark, Tait Johansson and Jean Sangdahl got 114. Sally Laughlin, Betty Rist et al., had 106 and five other groups topped 100.




