# SPRING MIGRATION 1987



This year again, we had a warmer than average spring, not as warm perhaps as last year, but still one of the warmer ones of recent memory. The winter of 1986-87 started off as if it really meant business. November, December and especially January produced staggering amounts of snow, particularly in the southern mountains. Then, just as many of us were about to give up, the capricious quality of northern New England weather showed itself, and we got almost no snow in February and relatively little in March and April. Temperatures, however, stayed cold in February and early March so that there was little melting of the accumulations of November to January.

March was generally dry, with a fair amount of sunshine. Precipitation throughout the state averaged about an inch below normal. Most of the precipitation occurred on the last two or three days of the month. Monthly average temperatures were above normal throughout. The snowfall in the first two days of the month produced more in the north than in the south. Cold arctic air gripped Vermont during the middle period of the month, and on the 10th-11th temperatures in the north reached  $-10^{\circ}$  to  $-20^{\circ}$  F. for the lowest readings of the month.

From March 31 through the first week of April we were hit with a complex storm system which produced very heavy rain, particularly in the south. Waves of low pressure, moving along the front, produced several periods of precipitation. Temperatures fluctuated from the 50's and 60's down to the 20's. flooding occurred on many of the state's waterways and many roads were washed out. At Burlington the highest temperature of the month was  $68^{\circ}$  F. on 3/25, and the lowest was  $-2^{\circ}$  F. on 3/11. April, as noted, started out on a rainy note. Precipitation totals for the month were two inches above normal in the south, and a half inch below normal in the north. Statewide the month was about 5° warmer than the long-term mean and the second warmest April since 1968. Following early stormy period the temperatures warmed up nicely, into the upper 60's and 70's by the 11th in many areas. The closing days of the month saw a drop in temperatures and a return to snowy conditions. disturbances moving through from the 28th to the 30th produced 2-6 inches of snow in the south and anywhere from 1 to 8 inches in the northeast. This was the third consecutive month with above normal sunshine in Burlington. The highest temperature at Burlington in April was  $83^{\circ}$  F. on 4/21, and the lowest was  $20^{\circ}$  F. on

May was by far the driest May since 1982 for Vermont as a whole. The statewide average temperature was very close to the May normal. Temperatures were averaging below normal, until the last few days of the month, when an early summer heat wave pushed monthly averages up to about normal levels. Cold during the middle of the month produced some record low temperatures. Burlington tied a record low of 29 F. on the 16th, and broke another record low with  $31^{\circ}$ F. on the 19th. The Bermuda high moved in on the 27th and after that there were a number of severe thunder-



storms, mostly in the northern part of the state. Heavy rain, strong winds and large hail were reported in the Burlington area with numerous trees and power lines down. A tornado was reported in Williamstown.

The highest temperature for the month in Burlington was 92° F. on 5/30 during the Bermuda high period, the lowest was 25° F. on 5/3.

How did this affect the migration? The flood periods in late March and early April had a decided effect on the waterfowl migration, or at least on the birdwatchers ability to monitor it. After a rather dull March with a late ice-out in the Connecticut River Valley, Friday April 3 was the day when all the "quality" waterfowl were seen at Herrick's Cove (Rockingham). This was a reasonably decent day in between the flood periods. The next two days flooding and heavy rains resumed and it was difficult for many birdwatchers to get to the areas. By the time the weather had cleared and the waters had receded later in the week most of the birds were gone, not to be seen again this spring. When the Connecticut River is running as high and fast as it was during that period. nothing much is seen on the river except in such sheltered places as Herrick's Cove, Roundy's Cove and the Retreat Meadows.

The cold weather the first half of May caused, for the most part, a later than average arrival of insectivorous migrants. In the latter days of the month, as it warmed up, migrants streamed through and by the close of the period the picture was normal. The peak days at the VINS banding station in Woodstock were May 15th and May 18th.

As to changes in species numbers, many observers reported declines or increases in various species, groups, families, et al.. Many of these showed no clear trend, but for two groups, the swallows and thrushes, which everyone, who had a comment, reported as late and in poor numbers. One's thoughts go back to June and July of 1986 with its heavy rains and strong winds. Then there were many reports, some from non-birders, of observed nesting failures et al.. It seems that that period may have played a part in 1987's reported declines.

The writer observed a Bank Swallow colony at a South Londonderry site, where during the heavy rains of June 1986 the rushing waters of the West River caused the bank to collapse in the colony area. Thereafter only a few Bank Swallows were seen, and this year the colony shrank from a thriving 30-40 pairs to a handful. Presumably not only nesting failures but mortality among the adults was involved.

As far as rarities go, we had some, maybe less

Red-throated Loon, Bald Eagles (several), Spruce Grouse (several), Monk Parakeeet (exotic), Snowy Owl, Three-toed Woodpecker\*, Carolina Wren, "Brewster's" Warbler (several), and Orchard Oriole (several).

Despite some overall cool temperatures there were a number of very early dates for the following: Piedbilled Grebe, Red-shouldered Hawk, Broad-winged Hawk, Sora, Northern Flicker, Eastern Phoebe, Eastern Kingbird, Tree Swallow, Marsh Wren, Hermit Thrush, Wood Thrush, Brown Thrasher, Black-throated Green Warbler, Chipping Sparrow and White-crowned Sparrow.

The Birdathon was taken mostly on May 23, a few on May 24th and 25th. Participants recorded 182 species (+ 1 hybrid) on the Birdathon. The team of Walter Ellison, Nancy Martin, Dan Crook and Jean Sangdahl topped with 147, a new record for them. Second place with 138 went to Doug and Chris Kibbe, Don Clark, and Cheryl Boise. Third place, with 122 went to Jeremy Coleman and Tait Johansson. There was a tie for fourth place at 121 between the Sally Laughlin-Betty Rist team and Marion Metcalf. Eleanor Ellis and Hugh Putnam had 113. Four other teams had 100+.
A total of 236 species (+ 1 hybrid and 1 exotic)

were reported for Spring 1987.




