Vermont Bird Records Committee Report 1994

The Vermont Bird Records Committee met on 5 November 1994 for its yearly meeting to review rare bird reports. The Committee's function is to establish guidelines for the reporting of rarities and to review and evaluate records of rarities for their acceptability by future researchers and for inclusion in the state bird list. The Committee's recommendations are followed in the publication of records in Records of Vermont Birds. The Bird Records Committee consists of the managing editor of Records of Vermont Birds, the seasonal editors of Records of Vermont Birds, and the regional editors for Vermont for American Birds.

The Committee and the editors of Records of Vermont Birds express their appreciation to the many Vermont birders who report to Records of Vermont Birds and to the birders who have taken the time and trouble to fill out detailed reports on rare species. These reports add greatly to Vermont's data base on birds. Careful recording of the details of plumage and identification are necessary.

SPECIES FOR WHICH DETAILED REPORTS ARE REQUIRED

Write to the Vermont Institute of Natural Science for Rare Species Documentation forms (RSD's) or for Rare Species Nesting Report forms (RNR's).

- A documentation report is required for any species not included on the Vermont Daily Field Card and for any species significantly outside the usual dates of occurrence in Vermont.
- 2) In addition, RSD's are required in all seasons for:





FIRST STATE RECORD

SAY'S PHOEBE (Sayornis saya) - one, Brandon Training School, Brandon, Rutland Cty., 29 October 1994. Susanne S. Wetmore, Mary Lou Webster. Subsequently seen in the same area 1 November 1994 by Scott W. Morrical, Theodore G. Murin, George E. (Terry) Hall, and on 2 November 1994 by Julia M. Nicholson, Eleanor B. Pratt, Frederick A. Pratt. First fully documented state record. A previous report from Shoreham, Addison Cty., 16 November 1985 by Elizabeth Weeks, had been accepted as hypothetical.




PIED-BILLED GREBE (<u>Podilymbus podiceps</u>) - two, a pair in proper habitat, South Slang, Ferrisburgh, Addison Cty., 7 July 1994. J.I. Dye, M.C. Dye. Possible/probable nesting.

ACCEPTED AS HYPOTHETICAL

GREAT CORMORANT (<u>Phalacrocorax carbo</u>) - one adult, Lake Champlain at Tri-Town Water Plant, Addison, Addison Cty., 7 May 1994. W.G. Ellison, John D. Marsh. Distant and fleeting observation.

WESTERN SANDPIPER (<u>Calidris mauri</u>) - one, Brilyea Access, Dead Creek WMA, Addison, Addison Cty., 6 September 1994. S.W. Morrical. Rare and difficult to identify.

LOGGERHEAD SHRIKE (<u>Lanius ludovicianus</u>) - one, Rt. 17 at Jersey St., Addison, Addison Cty., 1 August 1992. Stephen D. Grohs. Not adequately distinguished from Northern Shrike except by date. Still, an important record.



LARK SPARROW (<u>Chondestes grammacus</u>) - one, Smith Haven, S. Londonderry, Windham Cty., 31 August 1994. W.J. Norse. Second sighting for the state; both are hypothetical records lacking confirming reports.

HOARY REDPOLL (<u>Carduelis hornemanni</u>) - two, Spaulding Rd., Addison, Addison Cty., 19 November 1993. F.A. Pratt, E.B. Pratt, J.A. Peterson, Thomas Heatley.

HOARY REDPOLL (C. hornemanni) - one, Alfrecha Rd., North Clarendon, Rutland Cty., 2 January 1994. J.M. Nicholson, B.R. Jillson.

TABLED PENDING FURTHER INFORMATION

KING RAIL (Rallus elegans) - one, Dead Creek WMA, marsh just north and west of Rt. 17 bridge, Addison, Addison Cty., 17-18 May 1994. S.W. Morrical, T.G. Murin, G.E. Hall, J.A. Peterson. Bird not seen. Identified by vocalization only. Tape recorded. Would be a first state record.

HYBRIDS, ESCAPES, SUB-SPECIES

BAR-HEADED GOOSE (Anser indicus) - one, Herrick's Cove, Rockingham, Windham Cty., 28 April 1994. Paul and Shirley Wagner. Thought to be an escaped bird.

COMMON REDPOLL (<u>Carduelis flammea</u>) - one "Greater" Redpoll formerly considered sub-species "rostrata," Smith Haven, S. Londonderry, Windham Cty., 6 January and 7 February 1994. W.J. Norse. The Records Committee felt that it did not have the expertise to take action on this report.
