
he El Nino winter of 97-98, the warmest in history, was followed by one of the warmest and driest springs in history. Across the region waterfowl were on the move early, many having been able to winter north of their usual ranges. In fact more than half the waterfowl had already passed through New England before March 1 (Field Notes, Vol 52, no 3, 1998). The melting of the snow pack in the mountains and resulting annual flooding of streams and adjacent fields also happened early and ended quickly. Most ducks were seen on lakes and rivers and did not linger. The songbird migration followed a different pattern from that of the waterfowl and was, from most accounts, distinctly disappointing. Very few warbler

"fallouts" were reported, and while we waited for activity, the migrants somehow passed over us without much notice. The local nesting birds arrived on schedule but certainly not early, and migration continued into June.

FROM THE MANAGING EDITOR

ver the past few months RVB staff have been working to keep up with technology, both in terms of producing RVB and in the way we receive and archive bird sightings. As I mentioned in a recent issue, bird records submitted to us are now entered into a database and stored at VINS. In addition, a group of dedicated volunteers have been recruited to help enter these data, thereby streamlining the process of producing RVB while easing the burden on the Seasonal Editors, who are also volunteers. LOONS THROUGH WATERFOWL

The ice went out on most frozen areas of Lake Champlain in mid-March, and the largest concentrations of ducks and geese were reported later in the month. Note the 30,000 Snow Geese at Grand Isle on 3/27 that included 2 Ross' Geese among them, then add 30,000 Canada Geese to the mix on the same day. A build-up of dabblers was found at Swanton on 3/28, with 127 Blacks, 248 Mallards, 186 Pintails and 4 Gadwall. Ring-necked Ducks were abundant in the north end of the lake with 750 at Grand Isle on 3/29 and 1683 at Swanton on 4/4. There was a "happening" on flooded fields west of Brandon where 9 Tundra Swans stopped to feed and remained in the area April 9-15 to the delight of state birders, most of the local community and newspaper photographers. This is by far the largest group of this species to be recorded in Vermont, most previous sightings consisting of 1 or 2 birds. Lastly, to top off this section were two extraordinary sightings at Shelburne Bay. The first was an apparent fallout of 66 Horned Grebes and 37 Red-necked Grebes on 4/22, and the second a sighting of 2 American White Pelicans on 5/22, only the fifth state record and a first at this productive migratory rest area.

HAWKS THROUGH WOODPECKERS

<u>Bald Eagles</u> on Lake Champlain rose to their highest numbers in mid-March as the ice was going out. On March 15th, 25 eagles were recorded at Button Bay in Ferrisburg, flying north at the end of the day as if going to roost. A pair of <u>Cooper's Hawks</u> and their nest was documented in Montpelier during April, and a <u>Merlin</u> appeared on 4/3 on the Johnson State College campus and later nested there for the second straight year. The season's only **Golden Eagle** was seen at Danby on 5/15. No exciting northern owls turned up except for an obliging <u>Snowy Owl</u> that was seen on 3/4 in a Bridport field where it had spent most of the winter. <u>Downy</u> and <u>Hairy woodpeckers</u> were present in expected numbers and were seen at feeders throughout the state. The <u>Redheaded Woodpecker</u> colony of 2-3 nesting pairs on Market Road, Bridport, was reduced this year to 1 bird seen 5/16 at the traditional location. It seems apparent that the landowner's cutting down of most of the dead snags may have rendered the area unattractive to this species. Although <u>Red-bellied Woodpeckers</u> are now more often seen in Vermont, none was reported during this season.

FLYCATCHERS THROUGH HOUSE SPARROW

There were four reports of Loggerhead Shrike, unusual for this species that appears to have been extirpated as a breeding species in Vermont. One bird was on a fence line in Weybridge where it was studied, documented and seen by several birders from April 26-28. Another report from Bridport a few days later could have been this same individual. A May 9 report came from Grand Isle, and the last was from Ferrisburg during the overlap period in April and could have been a Northern Shrike. A pair of Fish Crows attempted to nest at Red Rocks Park in South Burlington from late April through May, were seen by many and identified by size and vocalization. This was not only a first state record but a first state nesting record as well. A male Prothonotary Warbler, singing and building a dummy nest drew the attention of birders to a small island off Long Point, North Ferrisburg in late May. There were documentation and photographs of a Clay-colored Sparrow at Grand Isle for the second successive spring, and there was much discussion of it possibly being a hybrid between a <u>Clay-colored</u> and a <u>Field Sparrow</u>, but no definite determination was made. Two reports of Summer Tanager were the first ever for Vermont. One was of a male in Hartland on 5/1 and the second of a male and female in nearby Woodstock on 5/2, possibly the same male. This was an excellent year for most winter finches, carrying over into the spring season with good numbers and wide distribution. Notice especially Bohemian Waxwing, Pine Grosbeak, Common Redpoll, both Red and White-winged crossbills, Purple Finch and Evening Grosbeak. House Finch continued its decline. Our common permanent resident species, Black-capped Chickadee, Blue Jay, White-breasted Nuthatch, American Crow and House Sparrow were present in expected numbers.

Notes on the Documentation of Rare Bird Species


The Vermont Bird Records Committee (VBRC) emphasizes the importance of detailed, descriptive documentation of all rarities, rare nesting species or out-of-season species. It is frustrating for both the observer and the committee to have a tantalizing sighting of a rare species rejected for listing due to insufficient details.

The committee is anxious to involve all Vermont birders in producing as accurate a Vermont state list as possible. This list and all documentation must be credible to future ornithologists who will use the material for research.

In the field, writing down the salient points of identification, talking into a tape recorder, making a sketch or taking a photograph are ways to help with accurate recounting later.

The Rare Species Documentation (RSD) form is both for filing the reports and is intended as a guide for the information needed. After completing the first page, reporters may prefer to write the description of the bird on a separate sheet of paper while also checking the form for the details requested. The committee welcomes suggestions for improving the reporting and voting process.

Again, the VRBC expresses its thanks to all observers who have contributed valuable information to the Vermont state list.
