# WINTER 2000-01

1 December-28 February

inter 2000-2001 brought a return to old-time weather, in terms of a cold December and, ultimately, significant snowfall. Most of the more important blizzards came in March, but the overall effect was that of a hard winter. The cold weather and the lack of a January thaw meant reduced waterfowl numbers and generally more difficult viewing conditions for Christmas Counters and individual observers alike. The CBC results, however, were surprisingly good with 118 species tallied. This gratifying number reflects the fact that species diversity often holds up better than overall numbers when temperatures drop. This was true not only for waterfowl, but also for

half-hardy lingerers, especially among the wrens and sparrows. Indeed, it was a great year for sparrows with a host of interesting species present for the CBC season. First and foremost was the **HARRIS'S SPARROW**, resident at the Medveds'

feeder in Putney for the entire winter. This most cooperative bird brought birders from far and near to enjoy splendid views of a

true Vermont rarity. All of us who saw the bird are most grateful to the Medveds for the hospitality and patience they displayed over a period of weeks and even months. Other sparrows recorded during the winter included such difficult species as Chipping Sparrow, Field Sparrow and Eastern Towhee. A different sort of excitement was provided by the Dark-eyed Junco and the White-throated Sparrow, both of which arrived in record numbers and established new CBC highs. Northern finches were relatively scarce, however, with only White-winged Crossbill and Purple Finch adding bright tones to the usual whites and grays of the winter landscape. As for

rarities, the HARRIS'S SPARROW as well as a LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL in Brattleboro were the undisputed winners. Also of note were a nice selection of raptors, including as many as 2 Golden Eagle, perhaps 3 Gyrfalcon and 4 reports of Snowy Owl.

Notwithstanding a return in 2000-2001 to more typical winter weather conditions, waterfowl numbers and diversity held up surprisingly well, at least for the CBC season and on into early January. To be sure, observers had to work a bit harder than in recent years, but 20 species of duck is certainly an impressive total - and actually was one species greater than a year ago, when December was decidedly mild. Among the more noteworthy CBC sightings were a record 34 Long-tailed Duck at Ferrisburgh and a single Ruddy Duck, also at Ferrisburgh, this latter bird, being just the second CBC Ruddy Duck since 1984. Other good finds during the winter included a **Pied-billed Grebe** in Burlington, a **Gadwall** in Panton, a **Green-winged Teal** in Charlotte, and a **Surf Scoter**, also in Charlotte. Among the common species, numbers of both **Canada Goose** and **Snow Goose** were again impressive, although well shy of the extraordinary totals of a year ago. Also worthy of note were the large numbers of **Horned Grebe** and **Bufflehead** observed at such favored locations as Charlotte Town Beach and McNeil Cove.

# **RAPTORS THROUGH GULLS**

Leucisism is the lack of dark pigment in a bird's plumage

There were about 22 sightings of **Bald Eagle** for the winter, evidence anew that this splendid species continues to prosper. A minimum of 12 eagles (8 adults and 4 subadults) were located in Vermont by designated observers during the survey period (3-15-Jan).Similar numbers of both **Sharpshinned** and **Cooper's Hawks** were observed, almost exclusively singles, with just a sampling of sightings listed below. The less common **Northern Goshawk** was also well represented, while the decidedly uncommon **Red-shouldered Hawk** was reported twice, making it three winters in a row for this handsome buteo. Other rare raptors were also nicely represented with two reports for **Golden Eagle**, two for **Merlin**, and a surprising three for **Gyrfalcon**, a rare visitor from the far north.

Wild Turkey returned to earth after a remarkable showing a year ago, but the Ruffed Grouse continued to struggle with just 101 CBC birds, the poorest total since 1993. Once again the Gray Partridge went unreported, an unhappy state of affairs that has persisted since 1996. No such worries need extend to the larids, which produced respectable numbers for all the common species and just enough reports of the rarer ones to keep observers interested. Noteworthy were two reports of Little Gull in early December, a possible THAYER'S GULL at Blodgett's Beach on December 5, and a well-described LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL in Brattleboro on January 31.

# **DOVES THROUGH HOUSE SPARROWS**

Considering the relatively harsh winter, the Strigidae held up nicely, as 8 species were reported including a record 4 **Long-eared Owl** on the Mt. Abraham CBC and 4 reports of the ever-popular **Snowy Owl**, although all were apparently one-day sightings. Mildly surprising were multiple reports of **Red-bellied Woodpecker**, a species that has clearly expanded its range in southern New England. An **Eastern Phoebe** at the Medveds' feeder was an added bonus for observers awaiting a glimpse of the Harris's Sparrow.

Blue Jay, after an off year in 1999-2000, returned to normalcy, while American Crow seemed even more conspicuous than usual. Most other common winter residents settled for average to slightly below average numbers - though the Carolina Wren continued to fight its way back from the crash of 1994. Indeed, half-hardies fared remarkably well with species such as Winter Wren, Marsh Wren, House Wren, Ruby-crowned Kinglet and Hermit Thrush all finding their way onto the CBC roster. The American Robin, overwintered in remarkable numbers, falling just shy of the spectacular CBC record it set in 1994. A Gray Catbird in Bennington on February 18 was very late indeed. Bohemian Waxwing were scarce following their invasion of a year ago but Cedar Waxwing came back in force to establish a new CBC record of 4421 individuals.

The Rutland CBC **Common Yellowthroat** was unique for the season and **Yellow-rumped Warbler** were limited to just two reports. Sparrows put on quite a show with the obvious star the **Harris's Sparrow** in Putney. **Eastern Towhee, Chipping, Field, Fox, Swamp**and **White-crowned Sparrow** provided multiple sightings and contributed to the impressive total of 118 CBC species. Of even greater interest was the invasion in force by the **Dark-eyed Junco**. A 7951 individual CBC tally was more than twice the 1994 record. A similar performance was seen by **White-throated Sparrow**, though actual numbers, were less overwhelming. By contrast, northern finches were almost quiet with several species, notably **Evening Grosbeak** and **Common Redpoll**, in significantly short supply. Only **Purple Finch**, **White-winged Crossbill**, and **American Goldfinch** enjoyed what might be called flight years, while the most interesting finch wasn't northern at all: a male **Rose-breasted Grosbeak** in Bristol on February 15.
