Mountain Birdwatch 2.0 Route 4: Lone Mt., ME

Hike Duration/Difficulty: 4 miles on logging roads; about 2-3 hours.

Route/Trail Access: Off of 142, turn onto East Madrid Road. Continue for 5 miles and turn right on Barnjum Road. As of 2016, there is a washout about 2 miles up Barnjum Rd. (at 44.926088, -70.364592). Park here. Continue on foot. In 0.5 miles, bear right, cross a bridge, bear left, go another 0.5 miles and bear left, staying N on main dirt road. In about 3 miles, you will reach Point 6, where road hairpins to the right.
