- If more than 2 groups of loons observed and/or for lakes greater than 300 acres, give a verbal description of the location of each group in the "details box" of VT eBird. Example. Peacham Pond: north cove 2 adults 1 chick, Center of lake 4 adults, SW region 2 adults. If loons all over the place on a large lake, consider sketching a map on the backside and write down loon locations to make sure we don't double count. Then mail in the map with your volunteer hours form.
