

**DIRECTIONS TO FBMP SITE AT**

**Adams Camp**

**STOWE, VT**

From Stowe Village, take Route 108 North (toward Smuggler’s Notch) about 3.0 miles. About 0.3 mile beyond the Top Notch Stables on the left, turn left onto Brook Rd. Cross the covered bridge, bear left and drive up the hill to the Covered Bridge Condo complex. Bear right at the first junction and follow this road to the end, parking near the gated dirt road (being careful not to block access to the dirt road). Walk back down the road about 30m to a spur trail on the left that leads to the Catamount Trail. Alternately, you can walk up the dirt road about 20m to the Catamount Trail on the right.

*NOTE: All listening stations are along the right (north) side of the Catamount Trail and marked with blue flagging and an aluminum treetag.*

**POINT 1** – From the spur trail, walk about 130 m to Point 1, marked with a treetag (“VCE AC #1”), on a 6”dbh Yellow Birch behind a large flat boulder.

**POINT 2** – To reach Point 2, continue on the Catamount Trail for 250 m. You will go up a short rise just before the point, which is on a 4” Sugar Maple just before the trail becomes wet and seepy. There is also a long, downed log perpendicular to the trail at the point.

**POINT 3** – Continue for another 250 m through this wet section of trail. Point 3 is at a large flat rock, and is marked on a 4”dbh White Ash 2 m beyond the rock. Just beyond this point the trail dries out and you cross a small stream.

**POINT 4** – Continue for another 250 m. Just before the point you will cross a stream and go up a short hill. Point 4 is just before you reach the top of rise on a 3”dbh American Beech next to a rock outcrop with a large beech log on top parallel to the trail. NOTE: 20 m beyond the point is a wide trail junction with signage on the right.

**POINT 5** – Continue on to the trail junction and bear right across the stream, then bear left staying on the Catamount Trail. 50 m before reaching Point 5 you will cross another stream and bear left—Point 5 is at top of small rise at mossy rock, marked on a 4”dbh beech.
