The successful applicant will add field data collection and lab sample processing capacity to several VCE projects and work closely with VCE's science team. Key qualifications include experience monitoring biodiversity, diverse set of identification skills, proficiency in Microsoft products and strong written and verbal communication skills.

Position Summary

The Staff Biologist supports the data collection needs of VCE's science team. This position will work closely with staff scientists to reliably collect consistent field data following specific methodology related to a number of projects. We seek an individual who can share their enthusiasm for natural history with a wide audience through project related outreach and communications. With support from the Director of Conservation Science, the Staff Biologist will collaborate with VCE partners to provide support on joint initiatives. The Staff Biologist is expected to work closely with VCE's science team on a variety of projects including Backyard Ticks, Roadside Bumble Bee surveys, Plant Pollinator Interactions and Whip-poor-will surveys.

Terms

The Staff Biologist works out of our office located in the vibrant community of White River Junction, across the river from Dartmouth College. This is a full-time position with a salary range of \$40,000- \$50,000, depending on experience. VCE offers health, dental, vision, and retirement benefits plus 30 days of paid time off per year
